Wine Tasting Guide

FOR THOSE WHO AREN'T SURE – Cleanskin wines are "unlabelled' bottles of wine sold by wineries to reduce their stocks.

CLASSIC WHITE (2004) - SELWYN WINES - MARGARET RIVER (owned by Evans & Tate)

Vibrant strong Verdelho influence with green pineapple and passionfruit with orange zest and general citrus notes. The palate is ripe and round with a fresh acid finish. It has notes of orange, peach and green apple flavours. This wine has been a favourite now for the last 18 months.

CHARDONNAY (2003) - MIRANDA WINES - SAUSTRALIA

A Chardonnay out of South Australia. This chardonnay displays a fruit driven style with an intense cool climate fruit nose with peach and citrus orange characters dominating. This gives the wine balance and a clean finish -terrific value for money and very easy drinking.

${\bf SEMILLON/CHARDONNAY}~(2004)~(Blue/Gold medal Sydney show)$ - ${\it MIRANDA~WINES-SAUSTRALIA}$

An elegant wine with aromas of citrus, apple and peach, which combines beautifully with the subtle oak characters. The palate is rich with flavours of apples and citrus from the Semillon, which are complimented by the peach and dried fig characters of Chardonnay. For added complexity a portion of Semillon was fermented on oak which created a medium bodied wine and creamy texture with a smooth lingering finish.

CLASSIC RED (2003) (3rd Largest selling red in Australia) - *MIRANDA WINES – SAUSTRALIA* A fruit driven medium to full bodied style with soft tannins and good acid balance. Chocolate/cassis flavours along with some toasty charred oak are present on the palate and assist in giving the wine good length.

SHIRAZ (2004) - New! INTERNATIONAL CELLARS - SEAUSTRALIA (Hardy wines)

Earthy, cherry aromas complement the spicy pepper characters and sweet vanillin oak. Rich plum and dark berry fruit with velvety chocolate flavours are found on a well rounded, soft palate, with dry tannins, balanced acid and fruit sweetness.

RUBY RED (2003) - MIRANDA WINES - SAUSTRALIA

This wine is a lively wine which fairly dances across the palate with mulberry fruit and depth of flavour. Overall this wine is styled for sheer unadulterated enjoyment. A fantastic light red!

CABERNET MERLOT (2005) - *INTERNATIONAL CELLARS – SE AUSTRALIA* (Hardy wines) Intense fruit aromas of plum, blackcurrant and brambleberry fruit are complemented by a soft sweet vanilla oak background. The palate shows rich blackcurrant and plum fruit with cinnamon and cigar box notes. The wine finishes softly with a good persistence of flavour

CABERNET SAUVIGNON (2002) - *New!* - *INTERNATIONAL CELLARS* - *S E AUSTRALIA* (Hardy wines)

Bright purple in colour with garnet hues, this wine displays dominant fruit aromas of blackcurrant, plums and blueberry backed by spicy cigar box tones. A medium bodied, easy drinking wine, exhibiting ripe juicy fruit soft tannins and well balanced acidity with a persistent finish.

SPARKLING WHITE - SELWYN WINES - MARGARET RIVER (owned by Evans & Tate)

This sparkling white wine is made from selected white wine grapes predominately grown in South Australia's Riverland. It's light, fruity flavour and ever-lasting effervescence makes it an ideal celebratory drink or a great accompaniment to any aperitif. The wine's tremendous value means that it should be enjoyed on any occasion - no matter what the excuse.
