The time has come; the whispers grow louder day by day. We rise up in the final hours - the Renaissance is near.

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<u>Mercedes Lackey & Larry Dixon</u>

In the words of Mercedes Lackey: "I'm a storyteller; that's what I see as `my job.' My stories come out of my characters; how those characters would react to the given situation. Maybe that's why I get letters from readers as young as thirteen and as old as sixty-odd.

One of the reasons I write song lyrics is because I see songs as a kind of `story pill' -- they reduce a story to the barest essentials or encapsulate a particular crucial moment in time. Another reason is because of the kind of novels I am writing: that is, fantasy, set in an otherworld semi-medieval atmosphere. Music is very important to medieval peoples; bards are the chief news bringers. When I write the `folk music' of these peoples, I am enriching my whole world, whether I actually use the song in the text or not.

"I began writing out of boredom; I continue out of addiction. I can't `not' write. and as a result I have no social life! I began writing fantasy because I love it, but I try to construct my fantasy worlds with all the care of a `high-tech' science fiction writer. I apply the principle of TANSTAAFL (There ain't no such thing as a free lunch', credited to Robert Heinlein) magic, to for instance; in my worlds, magic



is paid for, and the cost to the magician is frequently a high one. I try to keep my world as solid and real as possible; people deal with stubborn pumps, bugs in the porridge, and love lives that refuse to become untangled, right along with invading armies and evil magicians. And I try to make all of my characters, even the `evil magicians,' something more than flat stereotypes. Even evil magicians get up in the night and look for cookies, sometimes.

Larry Dixon is a legendary artist and a fixture on the convention circuit. By his own reckoning he's been a guest of honour at 2006 conventions over the last 20 years. In addition to his world-famous artistry, Larry has also co-written several novels with his wife, Mercedes Lackey. His artwork can be found on countless book covers and in top role-playing games.

<u>Ippongi Bang</u>

Who is Bang?

Well, when we asked her for a biography, we got a CV and her measurements.

I must admit, Bang is hard to describe. She is whoever she wants to be, a Manga artist, a singer, and an actress. Beyond that, she is absolutely a fan girl and will be having as much fun being a guest at this convention, as we hope you will.

Here is what one American anime convention said about her:

"Have you been in the cattle barn on a farm, or at a state fair? Imagine a young Japanese woman tending to the cattle, then selling mushrooms by the road. That was nearly Ippongi Bang's life. After she graduated from high school, Bang attended a agricultural college and was training to become a veterinarian. But, at the same time, she was drawing Manga and making costumes... Manga and Cosplay won out over an agricultural career for Bang, and her multi-media career was born. For American anime



fans, it's a rare pleasure to see Bang, her husband, Hiroyaki Yab, and the rest of studio Do-Do at U.S. conventions. Bang seems happiest when there's a camera pointed in her direction, and the camera always has something enjoyable to photograph."

<u>Danny Oz</u>

There's this little bandy-legged fellow you might have seen capering loudly through Swancon once or twice, or even twelve times. Danny thinks of himself as a Perth fan and 2006 will be his 14th Swancon.

Danny's had a lot of names in his life. You might know him as Heap, but others will recognize Oz. This is the man who grew up as a drover, the son of a drover, with a dingo half-breed dog and a good hand with meat knives. This is also the man who writes strange fantasy stories and scripts about time-and-space travelling alien adventurers (and gets paid for it!), and who sliced his hand open on the VCR. He's an odd mixture of ocker Aussie and one-foot-in-thefuture fan boy, the kind of bloke who takes several generations worth of inherited bushman leatherworking skills and makes a Cenobite costume with it. He's gutsy, theatrical and full of laughter. He's also sensitive, compassionate, and likes talking to people. This is perhaps why he was such a successful Santa last Christmas. If you ask him, he'll show you the photos.

As our Fan Guest of honour, we are honouring a woman who has been in the limelight of WA Fandom for a very long time. Clubs and associations have come and gone, but she has been in the background, making it all work and being the fan mum who has looked after many of the people in WA Fandom. Her house has always been a haven for fans, hosting many meetings and, on occasion, events. She once stole Anne McCaffrey from an early Swancon for a jaunt around Perth. Motion to form an organising committee for the Western Australian Regional Science Fiction Convention

A Western Australian Regional Convention shall be held in the year The name of Convention shall be The Convention shall be held between the dates of The Convention organizing committee shall be a sub-committee of WASFF and shall comprise: Convenor:.... Treasurer:.... And further committee members shall be: The desired venue shall be The desired invited guests shall be.....

The organising committee undertakes to be bound by and operate under the Constitution and By-Laws of WASFF. The organising committee acknowledges it has at least the following obligations:

- The committee is responsible for the organization of the WA Science Fiction Convention under the supervision of the WASFF board.
- The committee shall provide regular reports to the WASFF board to their satisfaction.
- Any surplus made by the Annual Science Fiction Convention is returned to the control of the WASFF board.
- The committee shall make every endeavour to return the seed funds provided to it by WASFF;
- The committee shall endeavour to return an additional 10% of the amount of seed money provided to fund the convention;
- The committee shall provide the Treasurer of WASFF with quarterly reports;
- The committee shall provide a suitable time and location to hold the WASFF Annual General Meeting during the convention;
- Finalised accounts and reports shall be presented to the WASFF treasurer no more than three months after the convention is held.
- The committee shall have the right to fundraise during the period the convention is current and have the right to give or withhold permission for fundraising to the successive conventions during that period.
- True accounts shall be kept of all sums of money received and expended and the matter in respect of which the receipt or expenditure takes place.
- Except with the authority of the Board, no payment of a sum exceeding one hundred (100) dollars shall be made from the funds of WASFF otherwise than by cheque on WASFF's bank account, but the Board may provide the Treasurer with a sum to meet urgent expenditure, subject to the observance of such conditions in relation to the use and expenditure thereof as the Board may impose.
- No cheque for greater than one hundred dollars shall be drawn on except for the payment of expenditure that has been authorised by the Board.
- All cheques shall be signed by two different members of that committee, or by two different members of the Board.
- The seed money provided to fund each annual convention shall not exceed 50% of the liquid assets not allocated to any other project less liabilities at the time of provision of the seed money.
- A convention organising committee shall not enter into any one contractual obligation that involves a financial obligation of more than 40% of WASFF's total liquid assets less liabilities with out first obtaining approval of the board. (As a rule of thumb this is about \$4000)
